#### Pastor's Message

Since I have become a priest, it has been my great joy to bless a number of different things: icons, homes, businesses, people. I remember the first day after my ordination, I came into the Church and, not quite knowing where to begin or what to do first, I read the prayers and sprinkled the Holy Water on some new vestments so that I could use them when I took Holy Communion to the sick. It was a simple act and, as one of my first, a little confusing because, alone in the Church, there didn't seem to be much remarkable, much spiritual, about these few words and this dash of water. The Christian life is sometimes like that—very normal. One question that I have been asked to answer since then is how or why we Orthodox Christians bless things.

You may remember that when the priest came to your house he gave it a good dowsing, and many of the

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Church's blessings are damp ones. Holy Water can be prepared at any time when we run out, but it is always prepared at least once each year and this on the Feast of Theophany. At that time, we recall the Lord's Baptism, the appearance of the Holy Spirit in dove form above His head, and the voice of God the Father ringing out: "This is my beloved Son..."


#### DAUGHTER' CORNER

#### Pastor's Message

For us, this feast celebrates the revelation of Christ as really and truly God. And this knowledge is known in the waters of baptism. We say, too, that in this activity Christ reveals the world as holy inasmuch as it can contain Him: if heaven is the holy place where God dwells and yet He chooses to dwell with us on earth, then earth—all of creation—must also be capable of being holy. When we sprinkle Holy Water, then, this is not a magic act but a continuation of that same revelation. Our homes, our things, and ourselves are revealed as holy when we choose to view them as part God's plan, as places and things to be used by and for Him. The water does not make things holy that are not; it changes our mind so that we can see that God can be everywhere and chooses to be with us. This is a blessing.

Every year you probably get a little bottle of Holy Water. Maybe you drink it, maybe you sprinkle it. This is a wonderful thing. You may be thinking, "Do I really then need the priest to come?" Surprisingly, no. But the priest comes to your home or business or you bring your icons or books to Church to be blessed by him because there are some things you just can't do alone. The priest comes as a representative of all the members of your local parish and all the members of the whole, entire Church the world over. We Christians always pray together, and it may be inconvenient for you to invite every single Christian to your home or business to ask his or her contribution to the blessing. Imagine the traffic. The priest is a sort of summary-a convenient representative. He comes, you all make the prayer, and sprinkle the water. The real challenge of a blessing, though, comes after it has been made. The real challenge is to see beyond that day and that act that this place or this thing or these people are God's home, that He dwells among them and makes them holy. This is a blessing.

Në Katekizmin tradicional të Kishës radhiten tre tipe lutjesh: kërkesë, falenderim dhe lavdërim. Ne mund të shtojmë një tip të katërt, që mund të quhet vajtim ose ankim para Perëndisë, duke e pyetur atë rreth kushteve të jetës dhe kuptimit të ekzistencës sonë, veçanërisht në kohëra fatkeqësie e turbullirash. Në Shkrimin e Shenjtë, ne i gjejmë shpesh këto katër tipe lutjesh.


Disa herë lutja është përkufizuar si një dialog me Perëndinë. Ky përkufizim është i mjaftueshëm, nëse mbajmë ndër mend, se ky është nje dialog qetësie, mbajtur në qetësinë e zemrave tona. Në Kishën Orthodokse, një përkufizim i vjetër tradicional, e quan lutjen "ngritja e mendjes dhe e zemrës tek Perëndia", qëndrimi në praninë e tij, vetëdija dhe kujtimi i pandërprerë i emrit, fuqisë dhe dashurisë së tij. Kjo lloj lutje është quajtur "të ecësh në praninë e Perëndisë."

Qëllimi i lutjes, është që të kesh një Kungim me Perëndinë dhe që të bëhesh i aftë të përmbushësh dëshirën e Tij. Të krishterët luten që t'a aftësojnë vetveten për të njohur Perëndinë dhe për të zbatuar porositë e Tij. Nëse një person nuk e ka dëshirën për të ndryshuar vetveten dhe për ta nënshtruar vetveten tek Krishti, në përmbushjen e porosive të Tij, ai nuk ka arsye ose qëllim për t'u lutur. Madje, sipas shenjtorëve është e rrezikshme t'i lutesh Perëndisë pa pasur mendimin për t'iu përgjegjur dhe për të ecur në rrugën që lutja na udhëheq.

#### The Entry of the Most Holy Mother of God into the Temple – Commemorated on November 21st

According to Holy Tradition, the Entry of the Most Holy Theotokos into the Temple took place in the following manner. The parents of the Virgin Mary, Sts Joachim and Anna, praying for an end to their childlessness, vowed that if a child were born to them, they would dedicate it to the service of God. When the Most Holy Virgin reached the age of

three, the holy parents decided to fulfill their vow. They gathered together their relatives and acquaintances, and dressed the All-Pure Virgin in Her finest clothes. Singing sacred songs and with lighted candles in their hands, virgins escorted Her to the Temple. There the High Priest and several priests met the handmaiden of God. In the Temple, fifteen high steps led to the sanctuary, which only the priests and High Priest

could enter. The child Mary, so it seemed, could not make it up this stairway. But just as they placed Her on the first step, strengthened by the power of God, She quickly went up the remaining steps and ascended to the highest one. Then the High Priest, through inspiration from above, led the Most Holy Virgin into the Holy of Holies, where only the High Priest entered once a year to offer a purifying sacrifice of blood. Therefore, all those present in the Temple were astonished at this most unusual occurrence. After entrusting their child to the Heavenly Father, Joachim and Anna returned home. The All-Holy Virgin remained in the quarters for virgins the near Temple. The earthly life of the Most Holy Theotokos from Her infancy until She was taken up to Heaven is shrouded in deep mystery. Her life at the Jerusalem Temple was also а secret.
