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the world outside those walls, reentering the normal, they feel good to have gone. Church, it's a nice place to visit, but I wouldn't want to live there. Like history, though, we must learn not to trust our predispositions.

We Christians cannot visit the holy. We cannot enter in and out of the presence of God. The Church is not a sacred precinct, a holy confine. God does not live just there, for a god in a box is no god at all. Rather, the Church is here for us to learn a particular way of experiencing God. It is here as an invitation to dialogue, but this must not cease at its doorstep. We find the holy in Church only because we are there. God's holiness does not dwell in the paintings we love and venerate. It does not inhabit the building we pay to support. God's grace is not in the hand or the mouth of the priest. God's holiness dwells in us all when we choose to submit ourselves to experience Him. The Church becomes holy, the universe becomes holy, when we find God there. That we are called each week to eat and drink of God Himself in the Eucharist shows us this, the very preciousness of our relationship, the profound holiness and intimacy of coming together. Our very bodies become moving temples of God. But we must come together. When we decide to interrupt or ignore this unity through carelessness or indifference, this is our decision alone. We look for God in Church sometimes precisely because we do not want him in our lives. Yet the threshold of the Church between the holy and the mundane is our barrier not God's. It is our perception and our flaw not His.

Come to Church as often as you can because this simple activity, these few short hours, are how we record the history of our lives. We draft and inscribe our records of being with God. We narrate ourselves, defining ourselves as creatures in relationship with the Creator. We are not alone. This is the message of our history. Believe it with your actions. Annual Church Picnic a Success!!!





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ICON OF THE MOTHER OF GOD - "IT IS TRULY MEET" - Commemorated on July 13th

The "It is Truly Meet" Icon of the Mother of God is in the high place of the altar of the cathedral church of the Karyes monastery on Mount Athos. One Saturday night an Elder went to Karyes for the allnight Vigil. He left, instructing his disciple to remain behind and read the service in their cell. As it grew dark, the disciple heard a knock on the door. When he opened the door, he saw an unknown monk who called himself Gabriel, and he invited him to come in. They stood before the icon of the Mother of God and read the service together with reverence and compunction.

During the Ninth Ode of the Canon, the disciple began to sing "My soul magnifies the Lord..." with the Irmos of St Cosmas the Hymnographer, "More honorable than the Cherubim...."

The stranger sang the next verse, "For He has regarded the low estate of His handmaiden...." Then he chanted something the disciple had never heard before, "It is truly meet to bless Thee, O Theotokos, ever-blessed and most pure, and the

God...." Mother of our Then he continued with, "More honorable than the Cherubim....' While the hymn was being sung, the icon of the Theotokos shone with a heavenly light. The disciple was moved by the new version of the familiar hymn, and asked his guest to write the words down for him. When the stranger asked for paper and ink, the disciple said that they did not have any. The stranger took a roof tile and wrote the words of the hymn on its surface with his finger. The disciple knew then that this was no ordinary monk, but the Archangel Gabriel. The angel said, "Sing in this manner, and all the Orthodox as well." Then he disappeared, and the icon of the Mother of God continued to radiate light for some time afterward.

The Eleousa Icon of the Mother of God, before which the hymn "It Is Truly Meet" was first sung, was transferred to the katholikon at Karyes. The tile, with the hymn written on it by the Archangel Gabriel, was taken to Constantinople when St Nicholas Chrysoberges was Patriarch. Numerous copies of the "It Is Truly Meet" Icon are revered in Russian churches. At the Galerna Harbor of Peterburg a church with five cupolas was built in honor of the Merciful Mother of God, and into it they put a grace-bearing copy of the "It Is Truly Meet" icon sent from Athos.
